Portfolio in Project Context




A portfolio is a group of programs and/or projects within the same organization, which may be related or unrelated to one another.

Portfolio is a collections of products and services to customer problem. A solution can be a portfolio as well.





Managing a Product Portfolio is a continuous process. It begins with conceptualizing a new product and continues through its lifecycle until its discontinuation. A Product Portfolio Manager looks after the ROI of each product to determine and make decisions based on the horizon.




Horizon 1: This is where your core products make up most of your revenue (cash cow).

Horizon 2: These are new and underperforming products that have the potential to grow much faster on a smaller base.


Horizon 3: Think of this as your pipeline to transformational innovation happens.




Portfolio Governance Organization




Agile and Portfolio Management




It doesn't matter what you follow in your organization; business agility is possible in both ways. However, the Product Portfolio provides customer-centricity.
